**EAST** 1452 Cyrville Rd. **745-1273**  Agatha Christie has to be one of the most prolific mystery writers of her time - well over 100 novels and short stories, over 20 plays for stage and broadcast, and then other works under the pseudonym Mary Westmacott!

Our approach as a directing/designing team, was to accept the challenge of doing a well-known and iconic play the likes of *Witness for the Prosecution*, and to try to ensure that Agatha's original story actually got told. That hasn't always been the case. Over time, directors seem to have had a penchant for adapting and putting their own "stamp" on Agatha's works! The stage play has been reformatted - and occasionally considerably re-written - many times for film and television audiences; and its evolution persists.

The original - created by Agatha Christie from her 1925 short story *Traitor's Hands* - opened in London on 28 October, 1953. Over time, Agatha grew dissatisfied with the ending - one of the few Christie stories in which a murderer escapes punishment - and in a rewriting she added a mistress for Leonard.

For the history buffs among you, the earliest film version was released in early 1958, with Tyrone Power as Leonard Vole, Marlene Dietrich as Mrs. Vole, Charles Laughton as Sir Wilfrid Robarts, and directed by Billy Wilder.

BBC Television produced Witness in 1949; also in 1949 NBC adapted it as part of The Chevrolet Tele-Theatre. The 1950 episode for the CBS anthology series was an adaptation directed by Yul Brynner. CBS produced a second adaptation in 1953, with Tom Drake as Leonard, Edward G. Robinson as Robarts, and directed by Richard Goode (an American classical pianist). Hallmark television produced the play in 1982, with Beau Bridges as Leonard, Diana Rigg as Mrs. Vole and Ralph Richardson as Robarts. The BBC produced another two-part version for Christmas 2016 with Kim Cattrall as Emily French (who is never seen in the original script), and that mini series was also issued as a standalone film.

And to round-out this partial chronicle, in August 2016, Variety reported that Ben Affleck was in talks to produce, direct and star in a remake with Matt Damon, and Jennifer Todd. That project has yet to be realized.

All of which is good grist for the G.O.A.T debates about Witness. Hopefully, our production will be able to stand on its own merit. Really, how could it not – Agatha's story, a cast of characters who were a joy to work with, and OLT's top-notch designers and crews. I can't thank them enough for all the hard work and the great fun (and a special tip of the hat to RMP!). And all of that is for nothing without you folks – enjoy your evening and many thanks for "putting a little theatre in your lives." See you again soon!

**Emily Walsh - Greta/Girl:** This is Emily's fourth turn on the OLT stage. Previous roles include young Irish woman Maire in *Translations*, swashbuckling kid-sister Sabine in *The Three Musketeers*, and most recently, the outspoken title canine character in *Sylvia*. Emily is also frequently seen on stage at Kanata Theatre. An avid tea drinker, Emily deeply appreciates Greta's commitment to pouring the best (in her opinion) cup in London.

Robert Hicks - Carter/Judge: Bob acted in his first play at the OLT in 1990, and has since performed in more than 20 plays including *Rumors*, *The Odd Couple, A Few Good Men*, and most recently, *It's a Wonderful Life*. Other volunteer activities include (with his partner, Jane Morris) developing and maintaining the online history of all the past productions of the OLT's 100-plus seasons as well as looking after all the headshots on the walls of the foyer. Bob was a long-time bike racer and volunteer in the Ottawa cycling community and his favourite cycling outfit these days is one he designed in red & black promoting the "Ottawa Little Theatre".

**Gordon Walls - Mr. Mayhew:** Gordon is a 33-year veteran of the Ottawa theatre scene and is thrilled to return to the OLT stage. OLT audiences may remember him some time ago in *Deathtrap* (EODL Best Actor nominee) as well as *Da, No Sex Please We're British*, and many others. Gordon is a regular at Kanata Theatre, most recently appearing in *A Man for All Seasons* and *Arsenic and Old Lace*. The Capital Critics Circle has also honoured him in productions of *Equivocation* (Best Actor and Best Play nominations), *Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde* (Best Play nomination), and *Noises Off* (Best Play winner). "It is a delight to once again share a stage with my spouse, Tracey, as we embark on another adventure."

lan Gillies - Leonard Vole: Ian is happy to be returning to the OLT stage after 2019's A Murder is Announced (Patrick Simmons). Having the chance to work with such a talented cast and crew has been an absolute blessing and privilege for him. He hopes that the last two years have been as kind to you and yours as they possibly could have been. He would also like to thank LL Cool Rae, Casey Beynon, and, of course, Karl Urban.

**Guy Newsham - Sir Wilfrid Robarts, QC:** Guy is so happy to be back with the OLT family in this comeback season, and to be learning from all the talented people around him. The role of Sir Wilfrid is a dream come true for Guy's family, as his father always wanted him to be a lawyer, and his mother always wanted him to be a knight. His most recent prior appearances at OLT were in *Move Over, Mrs. Markham, An Inspector Calls*, and *Towards Zero*. Guy also writes for the stage, and his short plays have received more than 40 productions in five countries. He is 56.

**Paul Washer - Inspector Hearne:** Paul is very glad to be back on stage at the OLT as Detective Inspector Hearne in this 2022 rendition of Agatha Christie's *Witness for the Prosecution* directed by Geoff Gruson! This will be Paul's 15th

time on stage at OLT, although Paul has done many other jobs around OLT for the past 24 years such as lights, sound, props, set construction, etc...... Always ready to lend a hand wherever and whenever because Paul LOVES OLT and that's where all his friends are. We are Sooooooo..... Happy to be back and as ALWAYS we know you are too! **Heather Archibald - Romaine:** Heather is delighted to be back on OLT's stage in this production of *Witness for the Prosecution*. In the meantime, enjoy the art!

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


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
